Annual Report for Competitive Exam Guidance Cell (2019-20)

The Competitive Exam Guidance Cell at Ramkrushna Mahavidyalaya, Darapur, was established as per the suggestion of the then Principal, Dr. S.B. Bhagat, with a focus on providing structured and organized guidance for various competitive examinations. The cell was formally launched in August 2019, during a period when academic work is typically lesser in comparison with the rest of the academic year, allowing students to focus on exam preparation.

Inauguration and Objective:

On 5th August 2019, the cell commenced its activities with the first lecture on English grammar. The primary objective for this particular academic year was to provide preparation and guidance for competitive exams.

Programms such as Talathi, Police Bharti, and the Combined Exam for PSI, STI, and Assistant. The goal was to equip students with the knowledge and skills required to succeed in these exams.

Structure:

A total of 60 hours of instruction was designed to cover key subjects, including:

English Grammar

Marathi Grammar

Current Affairs

General Knowledge with all sub i.e History political etc.

Mathematics and Computer

All optional Subject

These sessions were strategically planned to ensure comprehensive coverage of topics critical for competitive exams, with an emphasis on current events and general knowledge, which are vital components of all competitive exams.

Focus Areas:

For the academic year 2019-20, the guidance cell focused on Talathi, Police Bharti, and the Combined Exam for PSI, STI, and Assistant, considering the popularity of these exams among students. The preparation was primarily oriented towards these specific exams, with detailed lectures, problem-solving sessions, and mock tests to ensure students received practical and relevant experience.

Departmental Collaboration:

Each teaching department at the college was encouraged to contribute by organizing specialized lectures and programs aligned with competitive exam preparation. This interdisciplinary approach ensured that students could benefit from subject-specific expertise while also receiving holistic guidance.

Conclusion:

The Competitive Exam Guidance Cell effectively fulfilled its role during the 2019-20 academic year by offering well-structured guidance to students, enhancing their preparation for various competitive exams. The inclusion of a comprehensive 60-hour program, focused on key competitive exams like Talathi and Police Bharti, and the collaborative involvement of different departments, contributed to the success of the initiative.

Annual Report for Competitive Exam Guidance Cell (2020-21)

The Competitive Exam Guidance Cell at Ramkrushna Mahavidyalaya, Darapur, continued its mission in the academic year 2020-21 despite the unprecedented challenges posed by the COVID-19 pandemic. With academic activities severely impacted due to lockdowns and restrictions, the cell quickly adapted to an online mode of instruction to ensure students did not miss out on vital competitive exam preparation.

Adaptation to the Pandemic:

In response to the global health crisis, the cell shifted from traditional classroom sessions to online learning platforms. This transition was implemented to keep up with the need for social distancing while ensuring that students could still receive uninterrupted guidance. The cell leveraged platforms like Zoom, Google Meet, and WhatsApp groups to deliver lectures, conduct mock tests, and provide study materials.

Inauguration and Objective:

The online sessions commenced on 1st August 2020, with a virtual inaugural lecture focused on English grammar. The main objective for the academic year 2020-21 remained consistent with the previous year—to provide students with structured preparation for competitive exams, including Talathi, Police Bharti, and the Combined Exam for PSI, STI, and Assistant. Despite the shift to online formats, the cell maintained its commitment to offering high-quality guidance to help students achieve success in these exams.

Online Structure:

In the 2020-21 academic year, the guidance cell organized a total of 50 hours of live online classes and an additional 10 hours of recorded sessions for self-paced learning. The subjects covered remained the same as the previous year, with minor adjustments to fit the online environment:

English Grammar: Covered through interactive live sessions, quizzes, and worksheets.

Marathi Grammar: Delivered through recorded video lectures and online assignments.

Current Affairs: A weekly update system was implemented, where students were provided with the latest news and developments through presentations and discussions.

General Knowledge (History, Political Science, etc.): Delivered through virtual lectures, along with question banks for self-assessment.

Mathematics and Computer Science: Conducted using live problem-solving sessions, screen-sharing tools for demonstrations, and practice sheets.

Optional Subjects: Students were offered personalized guidance based on their chosen optional subjects. Online one-on-one consultations with faculty were arranged.

To maintain student engagement and enhance learning, the cell also provided access to online resources, including PDFs, e-books, and links to relevant online courses.

Focus Areas and Challenges:

For 2020-21, the competitive exam preparation remained centered around Talathi, Police Bharti, and the Combined Exam for PSI, STI, and Assistant, as these exams were still highly popular among students. While the online format offered flexibility, it also presented several challenges, such as:

Digital Divide: Some students faced issues with internet connectivity or access to digital devices. To mitigate this, the cell provided recorded lectures that could be accessed at any time and shared study material through WhatsApp, which was more widely accessible.

Engagement in Online Learning: Keeping students engaged in an online environment required innovative approaches. The use of polls, quizzes, and interactive problem-solving sessions helped maintain active participation.

Practical Sessions and Mock Tests: Conducting mock tests was one of the more challenging aspects. However, the cell organized online mock exams using Google Forms and similar tools, allowing students to experience timed tests with instant feedback.

Departmental Collaboration:

Despite the physical distance, the involvement of various departments remained a key strength of the guidance cell. Faculty members from different disciplines continued to contribute through online lectures and consultations. Departments organized specialized webinars and workshops to cover specific areas of competitive exams. These collaborative efforts ensured students received well-rounded guidance, even in a virtual setting.

Student Feedback and Learning Outcomes:

The cell conducted regular online feedback sessions to understand student needs and address any issues they faced in the online learning process. Students appreciated the flexibility of online learning but also highlighted the challenges of internet access. However, most students reported that the cell's efforts provided them with comprehensive guidance and kept them motivated during the pandemic.

Despite the shift to online learning, the students who participated in the program during 2020-21 showed commendable performance in their competitive exams. Several students successfully cleared preliminary rounds of exams like Police Bharti and Talathi.

Notable Programs Conducted:

Online Workshops on Current Affairs: Weekly workshops covering the most important current events, tailored specifically for competitive exams.


Mock Test Series: A series of online mock tests with feedback, which allowed students to track their progress and identify areas for improvement.

Annual Report for Competitive Exam Guidance Cell (2021-22)

The Competitive Exam Guidance Cell at Ramkrushna Mahavidyalaya, Darapur, continued its commitment to supporting students in their competitive exam preparations during the academic year 2021-22. As the pandemic restrictions began to ease and academic institutions partially reopened, the cell adopted a hybrid learning model. This allowed a combination of both online and in-person classes, ensuring students could access guidance regardless of their location or circumstances.

Transitioning Post-Pandemic:

The academic year 2021-22 was marked by the gradual return to normalcy, as lockdowns were eased in August and classrooms reopened in September 2021. However, the shift back to traditional learning was not immediate, as only partial reopening was permitted under government guidelines. This necessitated a continuation of the online learning model alongside in-person sessions, resulting in a hybrid approach for the Competitive Exam Guidance Cell.

Inauguration and Objective:

The Competitive Exam Guidance Cell resumed its activities on 1st August 2021, offering both virtual and in-person sessions. The main objective for the 2021-22 academic year remained consistent: to provide students with comprehensive preparation for competitive exams such as Talathi, Police Bharti, and the Combined Exam for PSI, STI, and Assistant. The hybrid model aimed to leverage the best of both online and offline learning to cater to the diverse needs of students.

Hybrid Learning Structure:

With the gradual reopening of colleges, the cell organized 60% online classes and 40% in-person classes. However, attendance for in-person sessions remained low due to lingering concerns about the pandemic and the convenience of online learning.

Online Mode (60%):

Subjects Covered: English Grammar, Marathi Grammar, Current Affairs, General Knowledge (History, Political Science, etc.), Mathematics, and Computer Science were primarily delivered through virtual platforms like Google Meet and Zoom.

Recorded Sessions: Students had access to recorded lectures that they could watch at their convenience, ensuring that those who could not attend live sessions did not miss any important content.

Study Materials: PDFs, e-books, and relevant resources continued to be shared through WhatsApp groups and email.

Mock Tests: Online mock tests were conducted through Google Forms, with students receiving instant feedback on their performance.

Physical Classes: A limited number of students attended in-person classes, which focused on problem-solving sessions, group discussions, and mock interviews.

Hands-On Support: Faculty members individualized support during these sessions, helping students clarify their doubts and refine their preparation.

Focus Area

The focus for 2021-22 remained on the most popular exams, including:

1. Talathi Exam
2. Police
3. Combined Exam for PSI, STI, and Assistant

Students continued to receive detailed guidance on exam patterns, syllabus breakdowns, and strategies for tackling competitive exams.

Challenges Faced:

The academic year posed unique challenges due to the uncertainty surrounding the pandemic and the limitations of the hybrid model:

Low Classroom Attendance: While in-person classes were offered, many students preferred to stay online due to health concerns or the convenience of remote learning.

Engagement in Online Sessions: Despite the flexibility of online learning, keeping students actively engaged in virtual sessions was difficult, requiring innovative teaching methods.

Access to Digital Resources: Some students continued to face connectivity issues, which affected their ability to participate in live sessions. Recorded lectures helped bridge this gap, but it was not a complete solution.

Departmental Collaboration:

The success of the Competitive Exam Guidance Cell was due in large part to the collaborative efforts of the various departments within the college. Faculty from different disciplines contributed their expertise through:

Specialized Guest Lectures: Departments organized webinars and workshops that addressed specific topics related to competitive exams.

Subject-Specific Guidance: Each department offered targeted support, ensuring that students had a deep understanding of key concepts in subjects like history, political science, and general knowledge.

Annual Report for Competitive Exam Guidance Cell (2022-23)

The Competitive Exam Guidance Cell at Ramkrushna Mahavidyalaya, Darapur, fully resumed its in-person activities in the academic year 2022-23. Total 150 students registered. With the pandemic no longer a significant barrier to physical classroom instruction, the cell returned to its traditional format of face-to-face guidance and preparation for competitive exams. This shift marked the end of the hybrid model that had been employed during the previous two academic years, allowing for a more focused and structured approach to exam preparation.

Inauguration and Objective:

The Competitive Exam Guidance Cell began its activities for the year on 1st August 2022, with the inauguration led by key faculty members. The cell's primary objective remained unchanged: to provide structured guidance for students preparing for competitive exams such as Talathi, Police Bharti, and the Combined Exam for PSI, STI, and Assistant. In-Person Learning Structure:

Objectives of the Competitive Guidance Cell

2. To offer expert guidance on different subjects relevant to competitive exams.
3. To conduct test series and provide practice sessions in a range of subjects such as History, Geography, Marathi and English Grammar, Economics, Political Science, Current Affairs, and more.
4. To create awareness about the importance of competitive exams and to encourage students to pursue government and civil service careers.
5. To ensure that the students get a clear understanding of the significance of various subjects from a competitive exam perspective.

Activities Conducted (August and September 2023)

Class Schedule:

Regular classes were conducted from Monday to Thursday, from 9:00 AM to 11:00 AM. Each day included two sessions, with a minimum of 5 to 6 lectures for each subject resource person. Guest lectures were organized on any working day as required.

Time Table:

Each resource person conducted lectures on their specialized subject. Below is a brief summary of the subjects covered:

Dr. Anil Bhagat: Marathi Language and Grammar

Key Highlights

1. Resource Persons:

Highly experienced and qualified faculty from Ramkrushna Mahavidyalaya and visiting experts were invited to deliver lectures and provide in-depth guidance on various topics.

2. Lectures and Subject Focus:

A total of 6 subjects were covered weekly, focusing on core areas essential for competitive exams. Additional sessions on Computer Science and ICT were also conducted by visiting experts.

3. No Fees Policy:

As per the cell's establishment guidelines, no fees were charged to students for this guidance program, making it accessible to all, especially those from economically weaker sections.

4. Test Series and Practice Sessions:

Regular test series were conducted at the end of each month, covering the subjects taught during that period. The practice tests helped students evaluate their progress and understand areas needing improvement.

5. Guest Lectures:

Visiting guest lecturers were invited based on their availability. These lectures provided students with insights into practical aspects of competitive exams, current trends, and motivational sessions.

Challenges Faced

Student Engagement:

While the total registration was 163 students, maintaining regular attendance and active participation during all sessions was a challenge, especially during the rainy season.

Guest Lectures:

Arranging guest lectures on suitable dates was sometimes difficult due to faculty availability.

Outcome

The Competitive Guidance Cell successfully guided and mentored 163 registered students for the academic year 2023-24.

Several students reported improvement in their understanding of the core subjects, and mock tests showed increased performance levels.

The cell's efforts have continued to provide a valuable resource for students aiming to clear competitive exams and pursue careers in public service.

Future Plans


Expanding the resource pool by inviting more industry professionals and experienced competitive exam aspirants as guest lecturers.
